Dear Mayor Pernarowski:

I regret that it has taken some time to get back to you regarding your invitation to participate in a public education session in Terrace on February 1, 2011. I have been travelling with the Community Advisory Board meetings and am now back in my office.

As we discussed, we look for opportunities to communicate and consult the public about the Northern Gateway Pipelines Project, and appreciate your offer to participate in a public education session.

We accept your offer based on specific points and conditions discussed during our conversation on November 22. I would like to reiterate these points, for greater certainty and clarity.


- The City of Terrace wants to facilitate an education session regarding the Northern Gateway Pipelines Project that would attract the general public to listen to speakers representing different perspectives. The City of Terrace is confident that many people interested in learning more about the project will attend and that the event is being organized through invitations and the facilitator to avoid attracting only those who oppose the project.
- The education session is not a debate. Each speaker will have 15 minutes to present their position and there will be a one hour q/a session. Questions between speakers will not be allowed.
- The moderator will ensure that people ask specific questions and do not grand stand. This will be accomplished by limiting the time allowed for each question. For fairness, answers will also be limited. Enbridge suggests that written questions also be taken and read out by the moderator.
- We understand that two groups are sponsoring this event representing different perspectives on the project: The Kitimat Terrace Labour Council; and, the Terrace Economic Development Authority.
- The City of Terrace has balanced the presenters to reflect different positions: Greg Brown from Friends of Wild Salmon, Gerald Wesley representing an Aboriginal perspective, Mayor Mike Bernier of City of Dawson Creek, and a representative of Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipelines Project.

Given recent experiences which have threatened the safety and security of Enbridge employees and the general public, Enbridge will not participate in this session if any of these assumptions change. Enbridge takes this position based on our company's values and policies related to safety and a respectful workplace. For similar reasons, we will need to work with you to ensure that the event venue is selected and managed with explicit attention to participant safety and security.

We encourage the City of Terrace to extend invitations to groups such as the Chamber of Commerce and Kitimat Terrace Industrial Development Society to ensure a balanced audience.

We appreciate the interest and participation of the City of Terrace to learn more about the Northern Gateway Pipelines Project and to make additional information available to your citizens.
